Goal alignment and funding between RACs, WRAPS, and CDs were discussed.

Lori Kuykendall (Chair) explained that the WRAPS groups and CDs are being brought together today to discuss how funds can be allocated to put RAC plans into action while accomplishing CD and WRAPS goals. Funding and staff are limited and need to be utilized efficiently to reduce sedimentation and secure water supply. It was mentioned that KDWP&T needs to be coordinated with as well to properly manage lands and to leverage staff. Lori stated that at the last KWA meeting it was mentioned that WRAPS, CD, and RAC do work together to efficiently accomplish projects, to reduce redundancy and not reinventing processes.

As part of this discussion the RAC decided that creating a unified message would be beneficial. The RAC would like the message to incorporate the work and coordination that is being done, as well as the need to fund the KWP, in order to accomplish the region's goals and implement the RACs plans.

Allan Soetaert (PWS) made a motion to have the KWO draft a position statement to be presented to elected officials, and others that would benefit from this, that states the unified message from the RAC, WRAPS, and CDs. The motion was seconded by Gary Armentrout (PWS). There was no discussion.

- 5. RAC Drought Workshop: Bobbi Luttjohann (KWO) reported that the Joint RAC Drought Workshop was held on September 1, 2017 at the Dwight D. Eisenhower Learning Center. Bobbi reported that HydroLogics and KWO hosted the Workshop with sponsorship from Wolf Creek Nuclear Power Plant and KRWA. Bobbi stated that the MEKRO model was used to run drought scenarios to show how the model can be used for water planning and to reach RAC goals. RAC members participated by region to look at region specific scenarios and options to test model capabilities. The workshop had 32 individuals attend, 3 states, and 3 RACs were represented. Those in attendance from the RACs gave a report and feedback on the Workshop.
- 6. **Legislative, Funding, and Water Resource Updates:** Bobbi Luttjohann (KWO) reported that the Water Interim Committee will be held on October 31<sup>st</sup> at 9am and November 13<sup>th</sup>. The KWO and others have been asked to testify. This Committee is chaired by Rep. Tom Sloan. Others on the Committee are Rep. Doug Blex, Rep. Victors, Rep. Rahjes, Senator Kerschen, Senator Francisco, Senator Estes. There were no additional updates for Funding or Vision.
- 7. **RAC Membership:** Bobbi Luttjohann (KWO) reported that the KWA approved all new nominations and term extensions to 2021.
- 8. **State of the Resource:** Bobbi Luttjohann (KWO) discussed the SOTR document drafted by the KWO. Bobbi asked for feedback on what the RAC would like to see in the document and what would be useful to have in order for the RAC to talk to others in the public. It was stated that information on drought and T&E species should be included in the document.

<u>Don George (KDWP&T)</u>: reported that the KDWP&T is working on populating fresh water mussels that are threatened or endangered in order to reintroduce them into the waterways. This is not widely done and is a trial project. This project is funding by KDWP&T.
