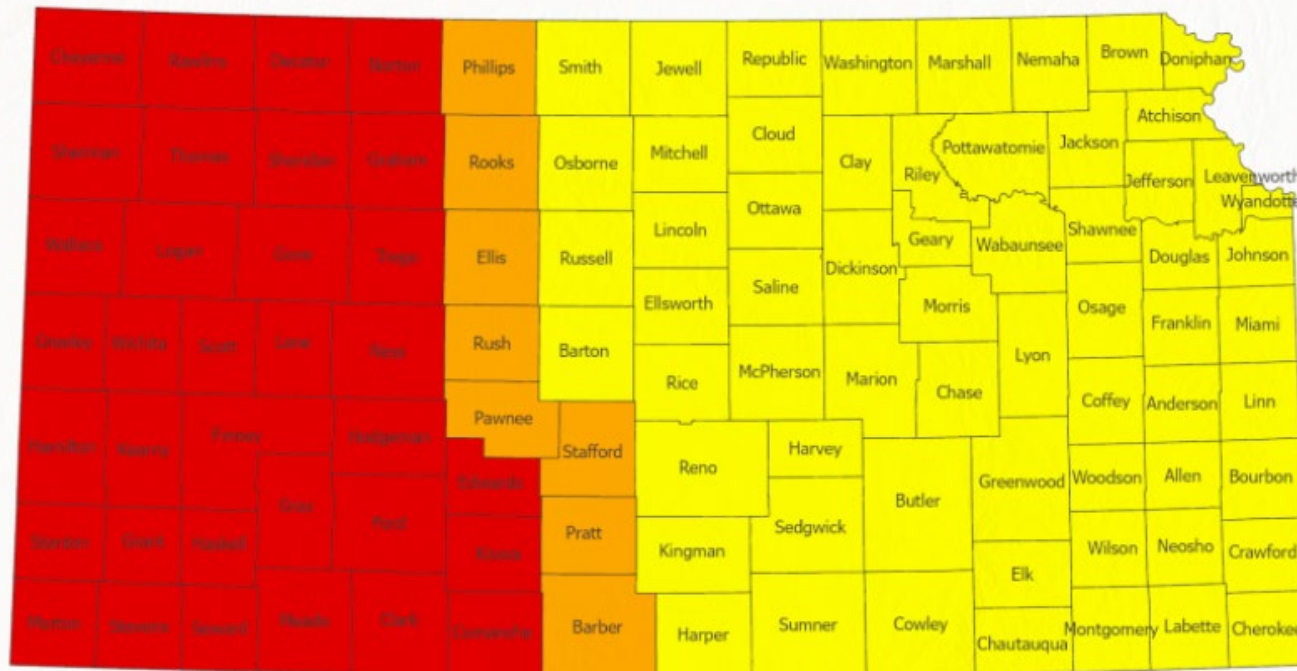

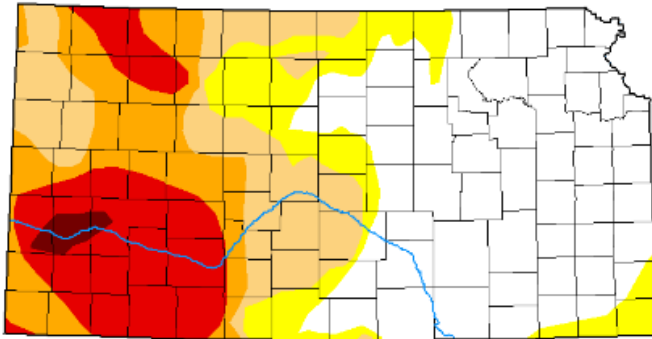

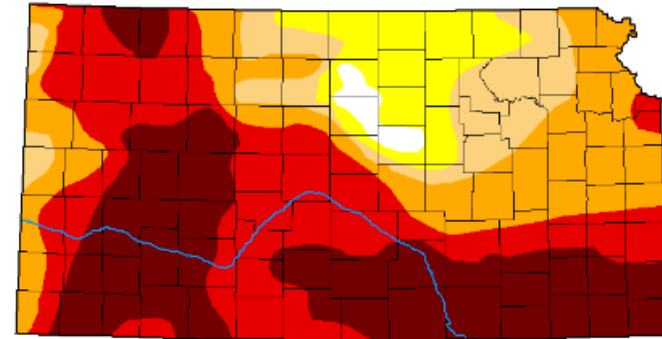


U.S. DROUGHT MONITOR – MARCH 17

Drought Classification



Climate and Drought in Kansas

Drought is generally [defined](#) as "a deficiency of precipitation over an extended period (usually a season or more), resulting in a water shortage" that adversely affect plants, animals, and people.

The effects of this deficiency are often called [drought impacts](#). There are also many [types of drought](#), along with challenges of predicting and monitoring drought.

The Kansas approach to drought is two-fold, **preparedness and response**.

This is a nation-wide service provided by the National Drought Mitigation Center, based at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, developed in partnership with the National Integrated Drought Information System and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Your report will become part of the permanent record, appearing immediately on an interactive map visible to the public, including authors of the U.S. Drought Monitor and the media.
